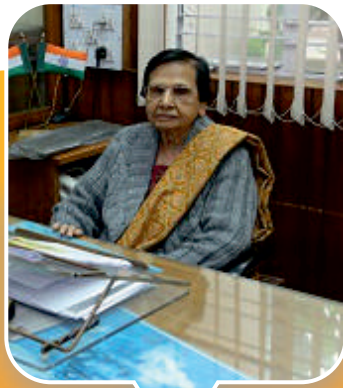

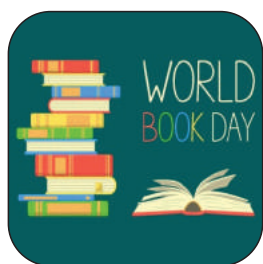
Earth Day

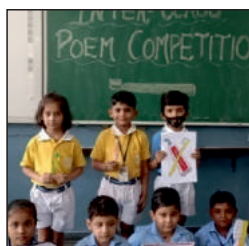

Ad Mad Show

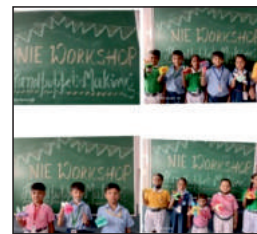

To cater to holistic development of our learners, this workshop aimed to enhance fine and gross motor skills.



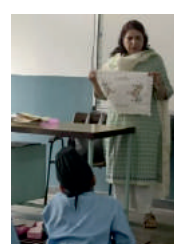
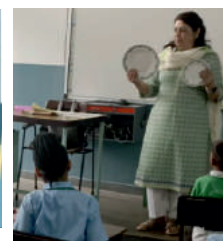
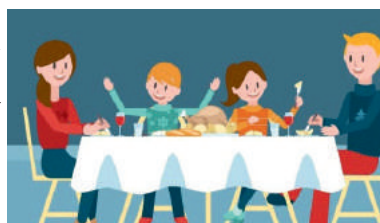
Happiness

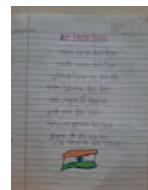


Mindset Curriculum

Happiness curriculum helps learners to apply life skills to deal with stressful situations and experience harmony in feelings. It also enables learners to communicate effectively.

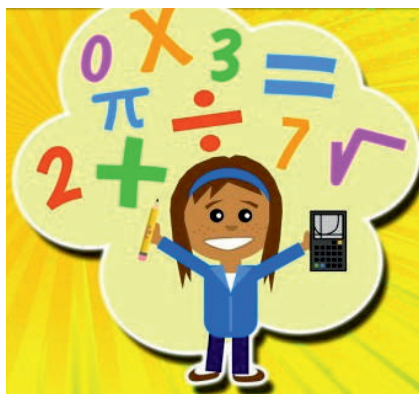


From Children's Pen

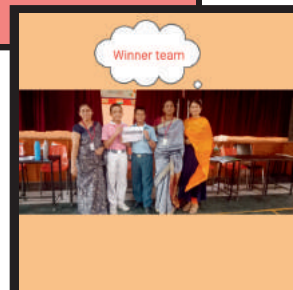
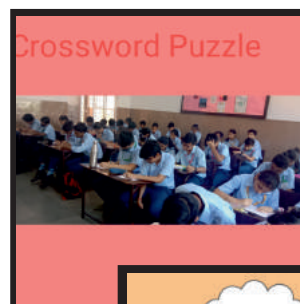

WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS

ADOLESCENCE

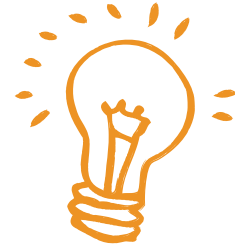

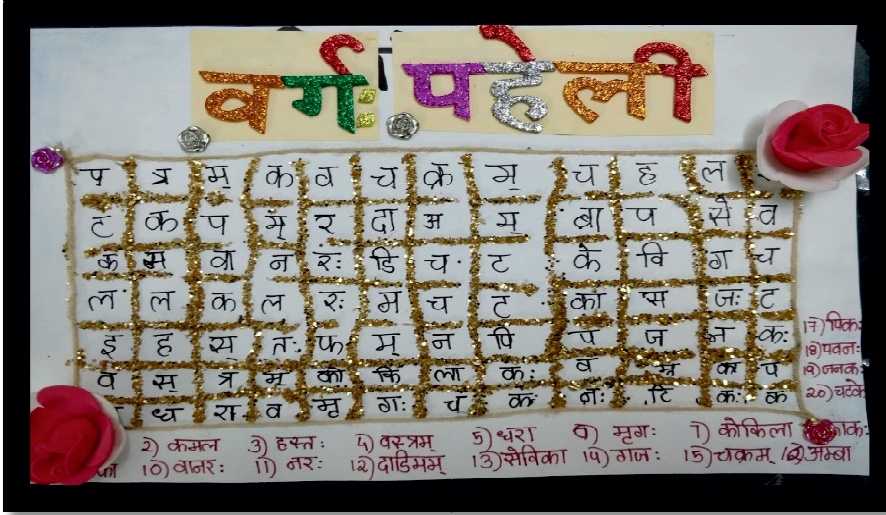
